NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Due to recent reports of cases of the **second strain** of influenza being reported in the Columbia area and around the state of South Carolina, numerous requests have recently been made from the laity, priests, and medical personnel who work with infectious diseases, as well as several hospital administrations, to continue to alter the exchange of the "handshake / kiss of peace," to some gesture or acknowledgement of the Peace of Christ that still "expresses peace, communion and charity." They have also recommended that the distribution of the chalice/s to the faithful continue to be suspended until the spread of the disease has safely subsided.

According to the CDC, "a person might spread the flu virus by droplets from a cough, sneeze or talking, but one may also get the flu by touching a surface or object that has the flu virus on it and then touching their own mouth or nose. Eating utensils and dishes used by those who are sick should not be shared without washing thoroughly. Healthy adults can infect others beginning one day before symptoms develop and up to five to seven days after becoming sick." Those who are ill should avoid crowds. If you are sick, then your obligation to attend Mass is excused.

For the safety and well-being of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, who are on occasions asked to consume excess Precious Blood, and that of the priests who cleanse the sacred vessels after each Mass, we will continue to distribute Holy Communion only under the form of the Precious Body.




