

"Get involved with the wonderful ministries we have at St. Joseph's." This is June Niggel Derrick's advice to all our parishioners. June has not only been a member of St. Joseph Catholic Church for many years, but also was a member of our original parish, St. Francis de Sales, which was located at 516 Maple Street.

June's father, Carl Joseph Niggel, Sr., came to Columbia in 1899 to assist in the carving of the corinthian caps on the stone columns of the front portico of the State House. He married her mother, Margaret Elizabeth Modlin, in 1905 and had seven children. June's mother did not become a member of the Church until about thirteen years after her marriage, and then was a devout Catholic, even playing the organ at St. Francis de Sales for years. She was also named "Catholic Woman of the Year" in 1953. They are considered to be one of the original founding families of St. Francis de Sales Parish - soon to become St. Joseph Parish. June, born in 1930, is the only living member of the family left, and has three daughters of her own, as well as six grandchildren, of whom she's very proud.

One of her earliest memories of attending Mass at St. Francis de Sales was Brownie. Brownie was Father Mackin's dog who used to wander around the "wooden hut." This was an old Fort Jackson building which had been donated to the church in which Mass was celebrated. In 1945, the Diocese received the bequest from Monsignor Charles Wood, along with a \$125,000 donation, to build a church and be named St. Joseph Catholic Church. June's brother, Carl Joseph Niggel, Jr. worked tirelessly to raise the matching funds to build St. Joseph Catholic Church for \$250,000. As you can see, the Niggel family was committed to supporting our parish in any way they could. Service to others is a vital part of June's faith and she models her beliefs. She's involved in St. Vincent de Paul, Clean of Heart, Women's Society, and St. Joseph's "One" Ministry. We are blessed to have her as one of our parish's original treasures!


