





DIVINE MERCY RETREAT

On April 30, 2000, Sister Faustina Kowalska was canonized a saint by Pope John Paul II, and in his homily he declared that, from this date on, the Second Sunday of Easter would be known throughout the Church as *Divine Mercy Sunday*. On this day Jesus said, "The very depths of My tender Mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy." This year Divine Mercy Sunday will be celebrated on April 8. Everyone is invited for a morning retreat on **Saturday, March 24 from 8:30 AM – 1:00 PM** in the Senior Center of the Ministries and Administration Building as we learn about and prepare for this upcoming feast.

In this retreat session, we will:

- Learn about the "basics" of Divine Mercy the Feast itself and the Extraordinary
 Promise given by Jesus to everyone on that day; the image of the Divine Mercy
 and what it signifies; the Novena to the Divine Mercy which begins on Good
 Friday; the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and how to pray it; and the Hour of Mercy
- Review the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy
- Reference St. Faustina's *Diary, Divine Mercy in My Soul*
- Look into the lives of the three "Apostles of Mercy": St. Faustina Kowalska, St. John Paul II, and St. Maximilian Kolbe as seen in the "Ocean of Mercy" DVD
- Pray the Stations of the Cross using meditations from St. Faustina

Whether you are new to the Divine Mercy devotion, have no idea what it is about, or simply want a refresher, please join the members of the Fatima Study Group as we seek to learn more about God's Mercy so as to share it with others.
