Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are members of a community of faith with a long tradition of teaching and action on human life, marriage and family, justice and peace, care for creation, and the common good. As citizens of the United States, we have a duty to participate in framing the discussion of public issues and the selection of those who occupy positions of leadership. We are blessed with religious liberty which safeguards our right to bring our principles and moral convictions into the public square. These Constitutional freedoms need to be both exercised and protected, as some seek to silence the voices or limit the freedoms of religious believers and religious institutions.

With the 2014 general election in the next week, I ask that you consider the issue of faithful citizenship and voting with a conscience. Conscience is more than a voice within calling us to follow what is considered acceptable behavior for the day. It provides a constant moral foundation that guides our thoughts and actions from the very simple to the most complex. We have a duty to fully form our conscience and increase its sensitivity to how the issues before us address and serve the common good.

In this coming election and beyond, I urge all faithful Catholics to rise to the occasion and participate in the political process. This kind of political responsibility is a requirement of our faith and our duty as citizens.

ECCLESIA IN AFRICA

he Church in Africa reveals a picture of both suffering and hope. Many people face a daily reality of food insecurity, water shortage, unemployment, lack of medical care, and illiteracy. At the same time, Catholicism is flourishing among the people of Africa. There are many new vocations to the priesthood and the religious life, with many of these new priests and sisters coming to serve the people of the United States. The Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa gives much needed aid to the Church in Africa while expressing the gratitude of the Church in the United States for the warm and generous assistance of the African priests and sisters in our parishes.

In Borana, Ethiopia, the people are traditionally nomadic, often living on the fringes of society with little or no exposure to Christianity. The Spiritan Fathers have been working for the past 40 years in this region. They run a village teaching program and a catechetical program for children, as well as seminars and workshops on the faith for youth and adults. In 2012, the Spiritans offered two weekend workshops for adults


and two separate workshops for the youth with a grant from the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa.

Workshop participants increased their sense of ownership toward their faith life and their sense of responsibility toward the work of the Church. In the village of Dhadim, one catechist named Fedha spoke of how the pastoral programs changed lives. He said that the growth of faith in the youth and their witness to the Church are two of the most visible signs of change in his community. Two new churches were opened and 182 parishioners received the Sacrament of Confirmation. The Spiritans also oversee Sunday school teaching programs, which give children a strong foundation in the faith.

With your help, the Church in Africa can actively evangelize the world. Projects like those run by the Spiritan Fathers in Ethiopia care for the spiritual needs of the African people. This allows the Church in Africa to give the world many vocations and a vibrant expression of faith. Please give generously to the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa.
